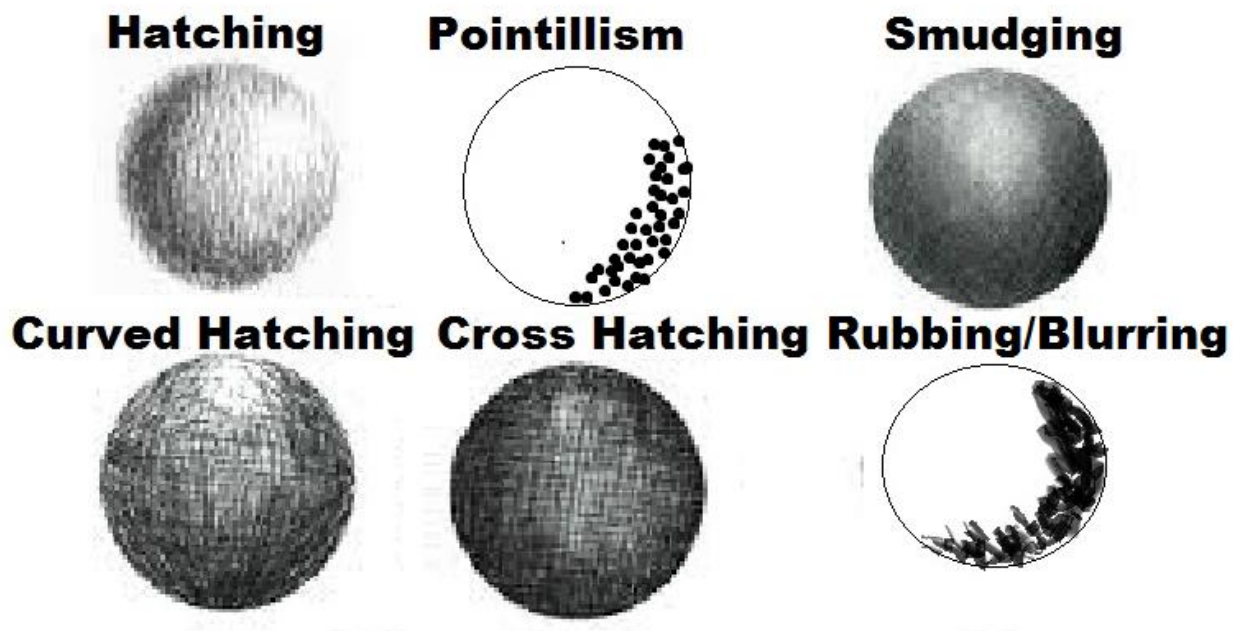


SHADING

Shading refers to various techniques used to depict light and dark areas on an object based on exposure to light. It can be used to clearly show height or depth, shape, size, entrance of light and the relationship between two objects that are close together.

Techniques of shading

1. Hatching: This is the use of parallel lines to create shades in one direction.
2. Cross-Hatching: This is the use of lines or strokes that cross themselves to create shades.
3. Curved Hatching: This is the used of intersecting curved lines to makes shades.
4. Rubbing/blurring Hatching: This is the use of flat strokes to make shades.
5. Pointillism: This is the use of dots to create shades.
6. Smudging: This is the use of blended shades.
