Meaning of co-operative societies

An agricultural co-operative society is a group of farmers who has come together to help themselves in their farming career and social life.

Also co-operative faming is the practice of agricultural production by farmers with the same understanding of pooling their resources together for the benefit of all.

OBJECTIVES OF FARMERS' COOPERATIVES

- 1. To help one another to raise funds for farming purpose.
- 2. To reduce the cost of inputs.
- 3. To help improve the quality of farm produce by sorting, grading, packaging and packing
- 4. To help themselves to look for marketing channels that will bring the highest possible profit.
- 5. To help themselves learn better system of farming.
- 6. To improve the saving habit of members.
- 7. To help obtain government grants, loans and subsidy, etc.

TYPES OF AGRICULTURAL CO-OPERATIVES.

There are different types of agricultural co-operatives societies.

- 1. **Investment and credit cooperative**: This is formed by farmers thrifting and savings. They borrow from and return loans to the society. Loans interests are usually 10% per annum or less.
- 2. **Producer cooperative association**: Here members contributed to produce something which they also sell jointly. They share the profit according to each person's contribution.
- 3. **Marketing cooperative societies:** Farmers here produce crops or rear animals separately but bring it together to be sold as a society. They person input. It is to cut off the middlemen, hence, enhance their own profit.
- 4. **Consumers cooperative society:** Farmers contribute to buy farm inputs and sometimes household needs. They sell cheaply to each other. They transaction among themselves according to their contributions.
- 5. **Multipurpose cooperative:** This type of group combines two or more of the activities of the types described above. They may buy, sell, market, invest as a group or do any other thing outside farming to generate income.

IMPORTANCE OF COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES.

- 1. They increase production of farm outputs.
- 2. Farmers get more knowledge on production techniques
- 3. Quicker marketing channels with higher profit are got
- 4. Farmers get inputs like fertilizers, chemicals etc at cheaper prices.
- 5. Joint storage facilities for grains and jointly owned farm machines help to ease farmers' work and reduce production cost.
- 6. Large farmers' cooperative unions employ cooperative account keepers to record and regularize their accounts within themselves, with banks and government. Vantages f cooperative Etc.

ADVANTAGES OF COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES.

1. They are managed democratically. Each member is entitled to a vote in any decision to be made.

- 2. Members buy from the cooperative society at a cheaper rate.
- 3. They encourage savings among members.
- 4. They encourage members to raise loans easily and at a very low interest rate.
- 5. They pool their resources together to start big businesses.

PROBLEMS OR DISADVANTAGES OF COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES.

- 1. Some of them are poorly managed by men who lack managerial skills.
- 2. Insufficient capital could pose a problem in a situation unwilling to pay their subscriptions.
- 3. Majority of their members are illiterates, and, so, fail to understand the working principles of these societies.
- 4. There is denial of individual initiatives.
- 5. Misuse of fund for political purposes and for other selfish benefit.

MANAGEMENT OF AGRICULTURAL COOPERATIVES.

- 1. To constitute a management committee: This committee will see to the day to day running of the activities and welfare of the society.
- 2. A constitution or bye law for members will be drafted by appointed members.
- 3. A bank account will be opened for the society with about three signatories to the account.
- 4. The cooperative then registers with the corporate affairs commission after due process.
- 5. All members are then involved in the activities organization. They have equal voting right.

QUALITIES OF A GOOD CO- OPERATIVE.

- 1. He must have team spirit.
- 2. He must show dedication to the cause of the group.
- 3. He must operate as a team (player) having brotherly, sisterly, and friendly relationship with other members.
- 4. He must show selfless service and dedication.
- 5. He must be honest.
